Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The Summer @ City Hall (S@CH) program offers an engaging learning experience for high school freshman, sophomores, and juniors. The S@CH program is in-person at the City of Sacramento's City Hall where participants are immersed in local government firsthand and gain valuable insights on how to become an active citizen in their community.

The City of Sacramento Department of Youth, Parks, and Community Enrichment partners with Natomas Unified, Twin Rivers Unified and Sacramento City Unified School Districts to bring this program to life.

Throughout the program, students are supported by city staff, credentials teachers, and Peer Mentors. The instructional team delivers a comprehensive curriculum daily covering topics such as civic engagement, activism, government structure, and much more grounded in youth development principles.

At the conclusion of the program, students present an advocacy project (Project City Hall) which is developed in smaller peer cohorts and presented to the Mayor and City Council. In addition, each

participant completes an internship where they are assigned to work with various city departments, charter offices, local non-profits, other government agencies, or youth programs. Upon successful completion of each component, students receive five elective credits, a letter of community service, and a monetary stipend.

The 2026 summer cohort had 81 new students joining the S@CH alumni roster as graduates of the program. Another 28 alumni members returned as Peer Mentors supporting the program in a leadership role. The grand total for the summer cohort was 109 youths representing 16 local high schools throughout the area.

WHAT IS SUMMER @ CITY HALL (S@CH)?

Summer @ City Hall (S@CH) is a six-week summer learning experience that provides high school students the opportunity to learn and how to become an active citizen in their community.

- Founded in 2011 as a partnership between the City of Sacramento Department of Neighborhood Services, Sacramento City Unified School District (SCUSD), WayUp Sacramento, & Bina Lefkowitz.
- Expanded in 2015 to Natomas Unified School District (NUSD) & Twin Rivers Unified School District (TRUSD).
- Credentialed teachers deliver a daily curriculum to students focusing on civic engagement, local level governmental structures, and youth development.
- Upon completion of the program, students receive five high school elective credits or community service hours and a stipend of \$500.
