**Application for the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle)
Oil Payment Program (OPP17)**

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Location: Citywide

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution** authorizing the City Manager or designee to: 1) submit an application for the CalRecycle Oil Payment Program (OPP17) in an amount not-to-exceed \$100,000; 2) execute all documents necessary to implement and secure such payment, if awarded; and 3) establish an Oil Payment Program (OPP17) Grant Project (G15003070) and related revenue and expenditure budgets in an amount not-to-exceed \$100,000 (Solid Waste Grant Fund, Fund 6207), if awarded.

Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: CalRecycle has established the Oil Payment Program to make payments to qualifying jurisdictions for the implementation of oil and filter recycling programs. To receive these funds, CalRecycle's grant program guidelines require the governing body of the applicant to adopt a resolution authorizing the local jurisdiction to apply for the payment program and identify the job title or his/her designee authorized as the signature authority to execute all documents necessary to implement and secure payment.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are consistent with the City's General Plan waste diversion goal to encourage recycling, composting, and waste separation to reduce the volume and toxicity of solid waste sent to landfill facilities.

Economic Impacts: None.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): No environmental review is necessary because the recommendations in this report involve a continuing administrative activity and are not considered to be a project in accordance with Section 15378(b)(2) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Sustainability: Recycling used oil and filters prevents toxic waste from entering the waste stream and reduces the volume of new wastes.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: Improper disposal of used oil and filters pose significant environmental risks and can lead to costly consequences. If awarded, the Department of Public Works, Recycling and Solid Waste Division, will use these funds to support both new and existing used oil and filter recycling, programs. Eligible incentives include appointment-based curbside recycling, offsite disposal options, and access to permanent household hazardous waste collection facilities or other certified collection centers.

CalRecycle's grant program guidelines require the governing body of the applicant to adopt a resolution authorizing submission of the application.

Financial Considerations: Staff recommends applying for funding from the CalRecycle Oil Payment Program in an amount not to exceed \$100,000. If awarded, establish the revenue and expenditure budget in the Oil Payment Program (OPP17) Grant Project (G15003070) in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 (Solid Waste Grant Fund, Fund 6207). No matching funds are required. There are no General Funds planned or allocated to this project.

Application for the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) Oil Payment Program (OPP17)

BACKGROUND

- A. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 48690, the State Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) has established the Oil Payment Program (OPP) to make payments to qualifying jurisdictions for the implementation of used oil and filter recycling programs; and
- B. In furtherance of this authority CalRecycle is required to establish procedures governing the administration of the Oil Payment Program; and
- C. CalRecycle's Oil Payment Program requires, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of the Payment Program; and
- D. The City of Sacramento Department of Public Works, Recycling and Solid Waste Division is seeking this payment to fund its used oil and filter recycling programs.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to submit an application for the CalRecycle Oil Payment Program (OPP17) in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.
- Section 2. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute all documents necessary to implement and secure such payment, if awarded.
- Section 3. The City Manager or designee is authorized to establish the Used Oil Payment Program (OPP17) Grant Project (G15003070), and related revenue and expenditure budgets in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 (Solid Waste Grant Fund, Fund 6207), if awarded, to implement new and existing used oil and filter recycling programs.
